

## Journal of Egyptology and history of black African civilisations

#### Recommendations to authors

All manuscripts for publication should be sent to <a href="revue.gnwt2019@gmail.com">revue.gnwt2019@gmail.com</a> (no later than April 30 of each year) in Word form of a maximum of 50,000 characters (including spaces and notes) or a maximum of 15 pages. Character type should be Garamond; font size 12 for the body of text (1.5 line spacing), 10 for indented citations (single line spacing) and 10 for footnotes. Gnwt is an annual journal published in September each year.

The journal may also publish book reviews, but these must be related to one of Gnwt's areas of focus: Egyptology or Black African civilizations. For book reviews, publishers are kindly requested to send a copy to Alexis Tague Kakeu (Director of Publication, responsible for reviews) at the following address: S/C 755 Faculty of Arts, Letters and Human Sciences, University of Yaounde I.

# The first page of each article should contain the following information:

- o Title of article in lower case letters, bold, font size 14;
- o Author's name and address;
- o Abstract in French and English (70 to 100 words for each version);
- o Keywords in French and English (maximum 5).

**Accents**: Use unaccented capital letters (A, E);

Long quotations (more than 3 lines): these should be presented without quotation marks and out of the text, with an indentation of 1 cm on the left and single line spacing;

**Square brackets**: Put in square brackets [] the letters or words added or changed in a quote, as well as the suspension marks indicating a break in a passage [...];

Quotation marks: Use quotation marks (" ");

Underlining: Proscribed;

Illustrations (tables, maps, graphs, photos, etc.): Centralize them, indicate their titles above and sources below. Their numbering must follow a chronological order (Photo 1, photo 2, map 1, map 2, etc.);

**Italics**: Italicize all terms and expressions that are not in English or French.

#### Notes:

- o Place references for books and articles within the text, indicating in brackets, the author's name, year of publication and the page(s) consulted. E.g.: (Kange Ewane, 1985: 21-22);
- o Use footnotes only for oral sources, archival sources and explanations;
- o Continuous numbering;
- o Use superscripts for footnote calls;
- o Place footnote calls before punctuation.

## Sources:

o **For oral sources**: These should be presented in alphabetical order of informants' names; in a tabulated form, with a serial number, names and surnames of informants, their age, social status, place and date of interview;

o **For archives**: Mention in full, at their first occurrence, the place where the documents are kept, followed by the abbreviation in brackets. Use only the abbreviation for subsequent occurrences.
